Dear Mayor Bunting and Dale County Mayors,

The Dale County Commission has worked with our local legislative delegation to provide funding for EMS services in Dale County. As a result, a bill to provide for a transaction fee on certain tag transactions in the country has passed and is set for a referendum in November, in conjunction with the general election. A copy of the Bill is attached.

The Dale County Commission fully supports the approval of this local bill by voters and plans to promote the legislation in every way legally possible. The Commission asks the Towns and Cities in Dale County and their officials and employees to also support the legislation so that local EMS organizations can enhance their services with this financial support.

The Mayors Association has asked the Commission to state in writing the methods and amounts of disbursement that the EMS organizations can expect prior to campaigning for the passage of the transaction fee on tags. The Commission has met with the Mayors Association and many others and has researched the best way possible for a fair division of the funds. As a result, the Commission has developed a Grant Application Process and a fair percentage allocation for all of Dale County's EMS organizations which are specifically shown in the two attachments.

Therefore, let this letter formally state that it is the Commission's intention and plan to allocate the funds among the Dale County EMS organization as stated in the attached exhibits and to follow the law specifically should the voters approve it in November, 2018. As you know from your experiences in the financial affairs of municipal government, there can always be slight adjustments based on circumstances, but rest assured that the Commission will fairly and proportionally distribute the tag fee funds to all EMS organizations listed on the attachment and will always consider the advice of the Mayors Association in such matters. WHEREAS, Dale County Commission, is hereby making known its intention to apply to the State of Alabama for a FY 2018 CDBG County Fund Grant under the provisions set forth in Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974; and,

WHEREAS, the request for Community Development Block Grant assistance adheres to the guidelines as set forth in the State of Alabama's Community Development Block Grant Final Statement, as well as, the provisions set forth in Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as revised; and,

WHEREAS, this legislative body of Dale County Commission recognizes Mark Blankenship, Chairman, as the appropriate County official authorized to act on behalf of the County in such dealings; and

WHEREAS, this body acknowledges that the Chairman's signature shall be binding upon Dale County Commission in such matters; and,

WHEREAS, Dale County Commission understands that the total estimated cost associated with the water system improvements on The Newton Water and Sewer Authority, Inc., which is in a CDBG eligible area within Dale County being applied, for is <u>\$337,000.00</u>, therefore,

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, by Dale County Commission, that the county approves the submission of the FY 2018 CDBG County Fund grant application requesting **\$306,000.00** in federal grant assistance; and that this legislative body of Dale County, Alabama, hereby authorizes Mark Blankenship, Chairman of Dale County Commission, to act as the appropriate County Official on behalf of Dale County Commission in dealings with the State of Alabama and to sign any and all necessary application papers for the FY 2018 CDBG County Fund grant application as well as any necessary contracts and other agreements relative to the implementation of the proposed project should funding approval be secured by Dale County Commission.

BE IT FURTHER HEREBY RESOLVED by Dale County Commission, that the County commits the sum of **\$31,000.00** in local cash matching funds to be provided through the Newton Water and Sewer Authority, Inc. to be used as Dale County Commission's local cash match obligation in conjunction with this request for FY 2018 CDBG assistance. Furthermore, Dale County Commission understands that said funds are to be utilized to compliment the FY 2018 CDBG funds being requested for the purpose of bringing the proposed project to fruition.

D. Failure to Obtain Quorum. Should no quorum attend within 15 minutes after the time appointed for the beginning of the meeting of the Commission, the Chair or the Vice Chair, or in their absence, another Commissioner, in order of seniority, shall announce that no quorum was present and that the meeting is canceled. The names of the members present for the meeting shall be recorded in the minutes of the next meeting of the Commission.

IV. Presiding Officer.

- A. Chair. The Presiding Officer is the Chair of the County Commission. The Chair presides at all meetings of the Commission. The Chair's responsibilities shall include, but not be solely limited to:
 - 1. Open the meeting, ascertain that a quorum is present at the appropriate time and call the meeting to order, if a quorum is present.
 - 2. Announce the business to come before the Commission, in accordance with the prescribed order of business.
 - 3. Recognize all Commissioners, the County Administrator, the County Engineer and the County Attorney, who seek the floor pursuant to these procedures.
 - 4. Preserve decorum and order, and in case of disturbance or disorderly conduct in the Commission chambers, may cause the same to be cleared or cause and disruptive individual to be removed.
 - 5. Declare the meeting adjourned when the Commission so votes, when a quorum is no longer present or at any time in the event of an emergency affecting the safety of those present.

V. Order of Business.

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- A. Official Agenda. There shall be an official agenda for every meeting of the Commission, including special and emergency meetings. As required by Alabama law, the official agenda for special and emergency meetings shall include only those items necessitating the holding of the special or emergency meeting.
- B. Special Operating Rule. Any matter of substantial importance with potential controversy and impact upon county government or its employees, must be brought before the Commission, either in work session or in a public meeting by a person, who shall give an explanation as to the reason for its necessity and its potential impact, and the matter shall lay over without action until the next regular session of the Commission, at which time it may be placed on the agenda and action taken if desired. This policy does not pertain to the conduct of day to day operations of a department of county government, or emergency matters for which time is critical, or to any matter at issue when the Commissioners unanimously agree to waive the rules.

STATE OF ALABAMA DALE COUNTY

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RESOLUTION OF THE DALE COUNTY COMMISSION

Whereas, local Dale County Act 2010-109 established the position of Chairman of the Dale County Commission effective in November 2012, and

Whereas, Act 2010-109 does not provide for the Chairman to have powers and duties above those provided for in State law, and

Whereas, Section 11-3-20, *Code of Alabama*, sets out the powers and duties of a Chairman of a county commission as follows:

-To preside over meetings of the county commission and to vote in the event of a tie vote of the commission

-To ensure that an accurate record of the meetings of the commission is kept

-To serve as signatory for the county commission on documents of the commission unless the county administrator is directed to do so

-To oversee and supervise the upkeep of the financial records of the county

-To issue and sign warrants

-To perform other duties as may be required by law

-To perform additional duties as deemed appropriate pursuant to a resolution adopted by a majority of the members of the commission

Whereas, the Dale County Commission has not granted the Chairman any additional duties other than those provided for in local and state law including, but not limited to, the authority to supervise, direct and control the activities of the county administrator, the Engineer, County Attorney, Sheriff or his department, elected county officials or their staffs, or give the appearance of representing the commission on his individual issues at public meetings or places, social media or on the county website, and

Whereas, the commission resolves to restrict the actions and powers of the commission chairman to only those limited specific duties granted to him by local or state law and

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Whereas, in furtherance of this action by the Commission, the following personnel changes are

-The solid waste department and staff shall be directed by, and answer to, the Engineer

-The county administrator shall be directed by, and answer to, to the Commission

-The maintenance supervisor and staff shall be directed by, and answer to, the Engineer

-The administrative office staff of the commission shall be directed by, and answer to, the County Administrator

-The EMA director shall be directed by, and answer to, the Commission

-The County Administrator shall perform all those duties as set forth in Sec. 11-3-18, Code of Alabama, and is specifically directed to serve as signatory for the Commission

-The Commissioner of District _____ is elected to serve as the Vice Chair of the Commission in the absence of the Chairman for the remainder of the current fiscal year and an election among the commissioners will be held at the beginning of each fiscal year for such

The Dale County Personnel Rules are hereby changed to reflect this action if necessary. The commission reserves the right to make further personnel changes or orders as necessary.
