Commission Meeting Minutes – October 26, 2021

The Dale County Commission convened in a regular session Tuesday, October 26, 2021. The following members were present: Chairman Steve McKinnon; District One Commissioner Chris Carroll; District Two Commissioner Donald O. Grantham; District Three Commissioner Charles W. Gary; and District Four Commissioner Frankie Wilson.

Chairman McKinnon called the meeting to order at 10:00am. Commissioner Wilson opened with the Pledge of Allegiance. Commissioner Carroll followed with prayer.

APPROVED – AGENDA

ALABAMA DEPARTMENT OF YOUTH SERVICES
AGENCY GRANT AGREEMENT
Fiscal Year 2021 – 2022

The Alabama Department of Youth Services hereby awards to

Dale County Commission
(Fiscal Agent, hereinafter called Recipient)

the amount of **One hundred sixty-two thousand two hundred forty and no/100 dollars (\$162,240.00)**.

These funds shall be used for non-residential diversion services for *Dale County* youth who would otherwise be committed to the Alabama Department of Youth Services (DYS). Based on youth needs, the *Dale County Juvenile Court (DCJC)* will develop or collaborate in the development of a diversion program, which may include the identification and selection of community providers. As a result of the interventions funded by these monies and based on the estimates provided in the grant application, the program will provide diversion services to 40 youth annually with an ongoing capacity of 20 youth at any given time. Thereby aiding in a reduction of county commitments to DHS (including CLIMB, formerly known as HIT), barring a significant increase in serious juvenile crime (i.e. violent felonies, felony sex offenses). To assist juvenile courts in the provision of services for children in need of supervision (CHINS), DHS will permit the program to provide diversion services to no more than 10% of youth with CHINS offenses.

These funds shall be utilized for the following purpose/activities:

The SAYS CHOICES Program is an intensive individual and family community/home-based treatment program for medium to high-risk youth. Services include individual and family counseling in their natural environment with a focus on a multi-disciplinary approach, implementing multi-systemic therapy, family systems interventions, cognitive behavioral therapy, group counseling (includes anger management, substance abuse, interpersonal skills, accountability), case management, Why Try/Parent Project and aftercare services.

The program that receives funding from this grant will:

- Serve youth who would have historically been committed to the Alabama Department of Youth Services (CLIMB or regular DHS) in the absence of the funded program. Specifically, this includes youth with the following characteristics:
 - Males / Females between the ages of 12 – 18
 - Delinquent youth with a medium to high risk of re-arrest, as determined by the risk assessment instrument available on the DHS website
- Be developed by or in collaboration with the *Dale County Juvenile Court (DCJC)*.
- Conduct regular self-evaluations of program effectiveness, including evaluations that track outcomes for children served by the program (GIMS outcome measures).
- Maintain data on program participants as required in the DHS Grantee Information Management System database (GIMS) on a monthly basis.
- Produce an annual report for the October - September fiscal year by utilizing the form available on the DHS website. Each such completed annual report shall be made available to the Alabama Department of Youth Services by November 30. Decisions about renewing grants may be made based on the courts' ability to show through these reports that the funds have been effective in diverting youth from commitment to DHS or CLIMB.

To ensure fiscally responsible management of state funds, quarterly evaluative criteria are integral to the diversion grant funding process. These criteria include, at a minimum, program adherence to youth capacity, annual numbers, average length of stay, and successful completion rates. At any given time within a quarter, program population numbers will be reviewed. If at the time of review the total number of youths reported in the

GIMS is below 50% of the maximum capacity, an initial warning will be provided. If a subsequent review during the following quarter indicates that the program population remains below 50% maximum capacity, the program may receive a 25% reduction in funding for the following quarter(s). Program and/or designated court representatives will be given an opportunity to explain the low population numbers. However, final reduction determinations will be made by DYS administration.

Both the DCJC and DYS acknowledge that this Award may be terminated at will by the DCJC or DYS for any reason. Any funds remaining from the award shall be returned to DYS upon the termination of said award.

The grant award contained herein is payable in installments, subject to the availability of funds and adjustments by the Alabama Department of Youth Services, as it deems necessary or advisable. All parties agree that prior year funds may be available to fund this program and have and/or will be applied to the total grant award. Any unexpended grant fund amounts shall be reported to DYS no later than November 1st. Nothing contained herein shall be deemed to be a debt of the State of Alabama in the contravention of the laws and constitution of the State of Alabama.

By signing this agreement, the contracting parties, including sub-contractors, agree that representatives of the Department of Youth Services will conduct site visits (both announced and unannounced), and that all records pertaining to the program, including financial records will be made available for review. At a minimum, these records would include: court referrals, JPO reports, service plans, progress notes and termination summaries.

Under a separate agreement between Recipient and DYS, Southeast Alabama Youth Services, Inc. is authorized under certain circumstances to receive reimbursement under Medicaid's Rehabilitation Option (the "Medicaid Rehabilitation Services Agreement"). In connection therewith the State is required to contribute from non-federal funds a portion of medical assistance expenditures (the "State Match"). The grant/subsidy award contained herein may be applied by DYS to the State Match for reimbursement to the Recipient under the Medicaid Rehabilitation Services Agreement.

The Recipient or its designee shall administer the services for which this grant is awarded, in accordance with the grant application, and applicable rules, regulations and conditions as set forth by the Department. This agreement is for a one-year period and may be extended for an additional year. Nothing contained herein shall be deemed to be a debt of the State of Alabama in the contravention of the laws and constitution of the State of Alabama.

By signing this contract, the contracting parties affirm, for the duration of the agreement, that they will not violate federal immigration law or knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien within the State of Alabama. Furthermore, a contracting party found to be in violation of this provision shall be deemed in breach of the agreement and shall be responsible for all damages resulting therefrom.

PROCEEDINGS PERTAINING TO THE REQUEST FOR
AND CALL OF A SPECIAL ELECTION ON THE RENEWAL
AND CONTINUATION OF THE LEVY OF THE 1
MILL COUNTYWIDE SCHOOL TAX IN DALE COUNTY
(Section 269, Constitution of Alabama of 1901)

The following resolution and order was introduced in writing by Commissioner

McKinnon :

BE IT RESOLVED, ORDERED AND DECREED by the Dale County Commission (herein called "the Commission") as follows:

Section 1. Findings. (a) The Commission hereby finds, determines and declares that there has been filed with the Commission a petition in writing signed by 200 or more qualified electors of the County, who are also freeholders, which petition (except for the signatures) is in words and figures as follows:

TO THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF DALE COUNTY, ALABAMA:

We, the undersigned qualified electors of Dale County, Alabama, who are also freeholders of said County, hereby petition and request that you call and cause to be held a special election at the several regularly established voting places in the said County on January 11, 2022, between the legal hours for holding elections, for the purpose of submitting to the electors of the said County the question of whether it shall be authorized to renew and continue the annual levy, for a period of 30 consecutive years commencing with the levy for the tax year that will begin on October 1, 2022 (for which first tax year taxes will become due and payable on October 1, 2023), of a special ad valorem tax for public school purposes in said County at the rate of 1 mill on each dollar (or \$.10 on each \$100) of the assessed value of taxable property in said County, being the tax that was originally authorized and provided for in Section 269, Article XIV of the Constitution of Alabama, it being intended that the said special tax to be voted on at the said election shall constitute a renewal and continuation of the said tax and shall not constitute an increase in the rate of taxation presently authorized in the County.

(HERE FOLLOW THE SIGNATURES OF MORE THAN 200 QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE COUNTY, WHO ARE ALSO FREEHOLDERS)

(End of Petition)

The Commission has caused the signatures that were signed to the said petition to be carefully checked as to their authenticity and the names of the signers of the said petition to be checked against the roll of the qualified electors of Dale County and against the tax rolls of Dale County, and the Commission has determined that the said petition was signed by more than 200 persons who are duly qualified electors of the County and who are also freeholders.

(b) The Commission hereby further finds, determines and declares that the said petition complies in all respects with the applicable provisions of Article 8 of Chapter 13 of Title 16 of the Code of Alabama 1975, except that the Commission has been advised that the requested duration of the levy (viz., for 30 consecutive years), exceeds the allowable time as set out in section 16-13-108 of the Code of Alabama 1975, as amended, and that it will be appropriate and consistent with said section 16-13-108 for the ballot relating to the renewal and continuation of the said tax be prepared in such a manner that a favorable result would not cause the tax to become due and payable later than 30 years from the October 1 next after the date set for the said election.

Section 2. Call of Election. An election shall be and hereby is called to be held in the County on January 11, 2022, between the legal hours for holding elections and at the regular voting places in the County, for the purpose of submitting to the electors of the County the question of whether it shall be authorized to renew and continue the annual levy, for a period of twenty-nine (29) consecutive years beginning with the levy for the tax year that will begin on October 1, 2022 (for which first tax year taxes will become due and payable on October 1, 2023), of a special ad valorem tax for public school purposes in the County at the rate of 1 mill on each dollar (or \$.10 on each \$100) of the assessed value of taxable property in said County, being the tax that was originally authorized and provided for in Section 269 of Article XIV of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901; it being intended that the said special tax to be voted on at the said election shall constitute a renewal and continuation of the said tax and shall not constitute an increase in the rate of taxation presently authorized in the County.

Section 3. Voting Places. The said election called shall be held and conducted at the regularly established voting places in the County except as to the casting of ballots of absent voters as hereinafter provided.

Section 4. Notice of Election. The sheriff of the County is hereby directed to give notice of the said election in the manner prescribed by law, by publication in *The Southern Star*, a newspaper published and having general circulation in the County, once a week for four consecutive weeks prior to the date fixed for said election, the first publication of such notice to be at least thirty days before the election. The said notice to be so published shall be in substantially the following form:

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION FOR
RENEWAL AND CONTINUATION OF THE LEVY
OF THE 1 MILL COUNTYWIDE SCHOOL
TAX IN DALE COUNTY

(Section 269, Constitution of Alabama of 1901)

Notice is hereby given that the Dale County Commission has called and ordered a special election to be held in Dale County on January 11, 2022, at which there will be submitted to the qualified electors of said County, for their determination by ballot, the question of whether the said County shall be authorized to levy annually, for a period of twenty-nine (29) successive years, commencing with the levy for the tax year that will begin on October 1, 2022 (for which tax year taxes will become due and payable on October 1, 2023), for public school purposes in said County, a special property or ad valorem tax at the rate of ten cents on each one hundred dollars (equal to 1 mill on each dollar) of the assessed valuation of the taxable property in the said County. If the said special tax is authorized at the said election, its levy will not increase the rate of taxation presently levied in the County but will constitute a renewal and continuation of the special tax at the same rate and for the same purpose now being levied in the County.

The said election will be held at the regularly established voting places in said County between the legal hours for holding elections.

Section 5. Form of Ballot. The form of the official ballot to be used at the said election shall be in substantially the following form, except that there shall appear on the envelope accompanying each ballot for absent voters an affidavit substantially equivalent to the applicable form of affidavit prescribed for absent voters by law:

Shall the governing body of Dale County, Alabama, be authorized to levy annually, for a period of twenty-nine (29) successive years, commencing with the levy for the tax year that will begin on October 1, 2022 (for which tax year taxes will become due and payable on October 1, 2023), for public school purposes in said county, a special property tax at the rate of ten cents on each one hundred dollars (equal to 1 mill on each dollar) of the assessed value of the taxable property in said county, which special tax shall be in renewal and continuation of the special tax at the same rate and for the same purpose that is now being levied in the said county?

() FOR proposed taxation

() AGAINST proposed taxation

The voter shall make a cross mark (X) before the proposition that expresses his or her choice.

Section 6. Ballots for Absent Voters. The form of the ballots for absent voters to be cast at the election shall be the same as that provided above except as follows:

(a) In lieu of the words "Official Ballot" at the heading of the ballot there shall be substituted the words "Official Absentee Ballot";

(b) In lieu of the instructions to voters appearing at the end of the Official Ballot there shall be substituted the following:

Instructions to Voters

The voter shall record his or her choice, whether for or against the said special tax, by placing a cross mark before or after the words expressing his or her choice.

(c) Each absentee ballot shall be accompanied by an envelope on which there shall be printed an affidavit in the form prescribed by law for absent voters for elections held in this state.

Section 7. Election Officers. The special election to be held in the County on January 11, 2022, shall be held and the results of such election shall be declared in the same manner and by the same officers as the results of regular elections for county officers, under the general election laws of the state.

Commissioner GARY moved that said resolution and order be adopted, which motion was seconded by Commissioner CARROLL and, upon said motion being put to vote, the following vote was recorded:
