MUTUAL EXERCISE OF OPTION TO RENEW PARTICIPATING SUBDIVISION USER CONTRACT

PARTICIPATING SUBDIVISION USER CONTRACT between SOUTHEAST ALABAMA SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL AUTHORITY, a non-profit public corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Alabama (the "Authority"), and Dale County, Alabama, a determining subdivision whose governing body authorized the incorporation of the Authority (the "Participating Subdivision").

RECITALS

The Authority is a public non-profit corporation organized and existing pursuant to the provisions of Sections 11-89A-1 et seq., *Code of Alabama 1975*, as amended, by Certificate of Incorporation filed in the Office of the Judge of Probate of Dale County, Alabama.

The Participating Subdivision and the other Participating Subdivisions wish to continue to have a site or sites for the disposal of Solid Waste that will reasonably accommodate their individual practices of collection, transportation and disposal.

The Authority is empowered to provide for the disposal of Solid Waste and to contract with municipalities and counties. The Authority has planned, designed, constructed and acquired the use of Authorized Receiving Facilities in or near Dale, Geneva, and Henry Counties, Alabama.

The Participating Subdivision and the other Participating Subdivisions have determined that it is in the public interest of each of them to endeavor to participate in the economies of scale and opportunities for Solid Waste disposal and resource recovery that each believes can be achieved through regional Solid Waste disposal facilities.

The Participating Subdivision and the other Participating Subdivisions have determined that it is in the public interest of each of them to make firm, long-term commitments regarding the disposal of Solid Waste.

The Participating Subdivision recognizes that the operation of the Authorized Receiving Facilities would not be possible without the agreement of the Participating Subdivision and the agreement of the other Participating Subdivisions as set forth in this Agreement and the other Participating Subdivision User Contracts, respectively.

NOW THEREFORE, these parties entered into a Participating Subdivision User Contract with an effective date of April 9, 2012 for a term of five (5) years. In said Participating Subdivision User Contract Article VIII, Sec. 8.1 thereof, the parties agreed the Agreement may be renewed under the same terms, covenants and conditions as set forth therein for an additional period of five (5) years at the option and election of both parties.

In exchange for the mutual benefits derived, the Parties now agree that the said Participating Subdivision User Agreement with an effective date of April 9, 2012 shall be renewed under the same terms, covenants and conditions contained therein for an additional term of seven (7) years. The effective date of this renewal shall be April 9, 2022 with an ending date of April 8, 2029, unless otherwise extended or terminated by mutual agreement of the parties.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Authority has caused this Agreement to be executed in its corporate name, has caused its corporate seal to be hereunto affixed, has caused this Agreement to be attested, all by its duly authorized officers, in two counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and the Participating Subdivision has caused this Agreement to be executed in its name, has caused its official seal to be hereunto affixed, has caused this Agreement to be attested, all by its duly authorized officials in two counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original.

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF DALE COUNTY, ALABAMA, APPROVING AMENDMENTS TO ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY OF HOUSTON, HENRY AND GENEVA COUNTIES AND DECLARING THAT IT IS WISE, EXPEDIENT AND NECESSARY THAT THE PROPOSED AMENDMENTS BE ADOPTED.

WHEREAS, the Legislature of Alabama has declared as follows:

In recent years changes have taken place in the economy of the state that have had a far-reaching effect on the welfare of its citizens. The agrarian economy that once prevailed in the state and provided the principal means of livelihood for most of its citizens has proven inadequate to provide employment for the state's growing population. The advent of mechanized and scientific farming methods has reduced greatly the number of persons required to obtain increased yields of agricultural products from land under cultivation. There has been a correspondingly greater dependency upon industrial development as the bulwark of the economy of the state. It is therefore appropriate and necessary that measures be taken to secure to the citizens of the state the benefits of a strengthening economy resulting from increased industrial development. Among these benefits are diversification of available job opportunities, higher salaries, better working conditions, lower consumer prices for industrial products, conservation and efficient use of natural resources, and maximum utilization of technical skills possessed by the citizens of the state. The police power of the state casts upon the Legislature the peculiar function of ascertaining and determining when promotion of industry, and the welfare of the people is so inextricably intertwined with industry and industrial development as to make its well-being a matter of governmental concern. The solicitation of industries and other concerns producing additional jobs and strengthening the economy of the state has become increasingly competitive, with the state being required to compete not only with other states, but with nations other than the United States of America. Therefore, it is imperative that public corporations be incorporated or reincorporated with authorities and powers sufficient, to the greatest extent possible, to permit the inducement of such enterprises to locate, expand, improve their operations, or remain in the state. It is the further intention of the Legislature that the public corporations authorized by this chapter [ALA. CODE § 11-92A-1, et seq.] shall have discretion as to the manner of expending funds at their disposal for the purpose of promoting industrial development, subject to the limitations detailed in this chapter [ALA. CODE § 11-92A-1, et seq.].; and

WHEREAS, the Industrial Development Authority of Houston, Henry, and Geneva

Counties has adopted a resolution proposing amendments to its articles of incorporation pursuant to ALA. CODE § 11-92A-11 in order to afford opportunity for Houston County, Henry County, Geneva County, and Dale County to work together to jointly promote the Wiregrass Area and to engage in economic and industrial development efforts for the benefit of all the citizens of the region; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of the foregoing, the Chairman and Secretary of the Board of Directors of the Industrial Development Authority of Houston, Henry, and Geneva Counties, in the name of and on behalf of the Industrial Development Authority of Houston, Henry, and Geneva Counties, have filed an <u>Application for Amendment to Articles of Incorporation of the Industrial Development Authority of Houston, Henry, and Geneva Counties</u> ("IDA Application") based upon the <u>Resolution of the Board of Directors of the Industrial Development Authority of Houston, Henry, and Geneva Counties of Incorporation of the Industrial Development Authority of Houston, Henry, and Geneva Counties of Incorporation of the Industrial Development Authority of Houston, Henry, and Geneva Counties ("IDA Resolution") that adopted the <u>Articles of Amendment of the Articles of Incorporation of the Industrial Development Authority of Houston, Henry, and Geneva Counties</u> ("Amendments") pursuant to the provisions of ALA. CODE § 11-92A-11, which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as if fully set forth; and</u>

WHEREAS, ALA. CODE § 11-92A-11 requires that the County Commission of Dale County, Alabama ("Commission") review and adopt a resolution to approve the Amendments before the Amendments can become effective.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Dale County Commission as follows:

- 1. It is wise, expedient and necessary that the proposed Amendments be adopted pursuant to Title 11, Chapter 92A, Section 11, of the Code of Alabama 1975, as amended.
- 2. The Commission hereby approves of the IDA Application attached as **Exhibit A** to this Resolution.
- 3. The form of the Amendments attached as Exhibit B is hereby approved.
- 4. The Industrial Development Authority of Houston, Henry, and Geneva Counties is hereby authorized to proceed in adopting the proposed Amendments by signing and filing the Amendments for record with the Judge of Probate of Dale County, Alabama.

ARTICLES OF AMENDMENT OF THE ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY OF HOUSTON, HENRY, AND GENEVA COUNTIES

In accordance with the provisions of Title 11, Chapter 92A, of the Code of Alabama 1975 as amended (ALA. CODE § 11-92A-1 *et seq.*), upon application for approval and authorization to the Houston County Commission, the Henry County Commission, the Geneva County Commission, and the Dale County Commission, and under authority and approval of the Houston County Commission, the Henry County Commission, the Geneva County Commission, and the Dale County Commission, the Directors of the Industrial Development Authority of Houston, Henry, and Geneva Counties hereby adopt the following <u>Articles of Amendment of the Articles of Incorporation of the Industrial Development Authority Houston, Henry, and Geneva Counties:</u>

1. Paragraph Number 1., entitled <u>NAME</u>, of the Articles of Incorporation of the Industrial Development Authority of Houston, Henry, and Geneva Counties is amended by repealing the paragraph in its entirety and replacing it as follows:

NAME

1.

The name of this Authority shall be the "The Industrial Development Authority of Houston, Henry, Geneva, and Dale Counties."

2. Paragraph number "7," entitled **DIRECTORS**, of the Articles of Incorporation of the Industrial Development Authority of Houston, Henry, and Geneva Counties is amended by repealing the paragraph in its entirety and replacing it as follows:

DIRECTORS

7.

The corporate powers, business affairs, and property of the Authority shall be exercised, conducted, and controlled by a Board of Directors (the "Board") consisting of 16 members—seven members appointed by the Houston County Commission, three members appointed by the Henry County Commission, three members appointed by the Geneva County Commission, and three members appointed by the Dale County Commission.

Houston County Commission appointments shall be made as follows: three of the members of the Board shall be appointed by the Houston County Commission from a list of appointees recommended by the Executive Director of the Southeast Alabama Regional Planning Commission and the President of the Dothan Area Chamber of Commerce; and fouresifi the members of the Board shall be appointed by the Houston County Commission from allist of appointees recommended by the four separate Houston County Commissioners. Directors appointed by the Houston County Commissioners. Directors any said director ceases to be a resident of Houston County, Alabama, such person shall cease to be a director, and such position shall remain vacant until a successor is appointed by the Houston County Commission in accordance with the Articles of Incorporation of the Industrial Development Board of Houston, Henry, and Geneva Counties ("Amended Articles").

The seven members appointed by the Houston County Commission shall serve for terms identical to their unexpired terms of office (not to exceed six (6) years) as members of the Board of Directors for the Authority as of the date of the filing of the Amended Articles as indicated below:
